## Document Formatting Standards Effective July 1, 2009

- 1. Pages printed only on one side and not permanently bound (but pages may be stapled).
- 2. A font size no smaller than 10 point.
- 3. Documents that are legible and of sufficient color and clarity.
- 4. Twenty-pound "white" paper (which is standard copy grade) or better.
- 5. Signatures in blue or black ink.
- 6. The corresponding names shall be typed or stamped below the signatures.
- 7. Seals or stamps that do not obscure with the printing or writing on the instrument.
- 8. The first page of the instrument must have a three inch (3") top margin and at least three-quarter inch (3/4") side and bottom margins. All subsequent pages must have at least three-quarter inch (3/4") margins on the top, sides, and bottom. The Instrument must also have the Attorney's Bar Number, if it is prepared by an Attorney.
- 9. If an instrument contains the following data, that data must be reflected on the first page:
  - a. The name, physical business mailing address **and** business or employment telephone number of the individual who prepared the document and of **every** grantor, grantee, borrower, beneficiary, trustee or other party to the instrument,
  - b. Return Address,
  - c. Title of the Instrument,
  - d. Any address and telephone number required by Section <u>27-3-51</u>, Mississippi Code of 1972,
  - e. The legal description of the property or indexing instruction per Section <u>89-5-33(3)</u>. If there is insufficient space on the first page for the entire legal description or the entire indexing instruction, immediately succeeding pages shall be used.
- 10. The following documents or instruments are exempt from the format requirements of this section:
  - a. A document or instrument that was executed before July 1, 2009.
  - b. A military separation document or instrument.
  - c. A document or instrument executed outside the United States.
  - d. A certified copy of a document or instrument issued by a court or governmental agency including a vital record.
  - e. A document or instrument where one of the original parties is deceased or otherwise incapacitated.
  - f. A document or instrument formatted to meet court requirements.
  - g. A federal tax lien.
  - **h.** A filing under the Uniform Commercial Code.

The law provides that non-conforming documents will be recorded, but will be subject to a \$10 additional fee.
